Reflections: Do You Desire Peace?

Isaiah 26:3-4—³You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you. ⁴Trust in the LORD forever, for the LORD , the LORD himself, is the Rock eternal.

2020 was a difficult year for everyone. On top of it all, our family lost our remaining aunt on my dad's side and my remaining uncle on my mom's side. It is sobering to have lost an entire generation. My uncle's death occurred during my annual time of reflection between Christmas and New Year's, making this reflection much more difficult but seemingly more important. The reminder that life is way too short bears the question, "How do I spend my last days left on this earth?" I was awakened at 4 a.m. on the day of my uncle's funeral with my marching orders from the Lord: peace for the present, peace for the future, and spread peace to others.

Life Focus #1 – Peace for the Present: Live the rest of my life here on Earth in peace, joy, and ultimate victory serving Jesus.

Isn't that what we all want: an inner peace so strong as to withstand all the storms of life? As the world is turned upside down, good has become evil and evil has become good. How do we live in this crazy world with an attitude of peace? The following three steps move us to not only experience peace for the present but afford us the opportunity to have peace for the future.

- A—Admit we were born sinners and must turn away from our sin toward God because God and sin cannot coexist.
- B—Believe in Jesus Christ to be our Rock, fixing our eyes on Him by reading the Word of God, hiding it in our hearts.
- C—Commit to living our lives in service to our King. We give our lives as an offering to our Lord and Savior Christ Jesus.

Life Focus #2 – Peace for the Future: Spend eternity with Jesus and Father God in heaven and with everyone who has turned from their sinful nature, believed in Jesus, and committed to serving Him.

Many people fear death because they do not have the assurance that they will end up in heaven. The secular world tells us that everyone will go to heaven, but that is not what the Bible says. John 3:16 states, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." We can all have assurance of reaching heaven by turning from our past life of sin, by trusting that Jesus is the Messiah, and by dedicating our lives in service to Jesus.

Life Focus #3 – Spread Peace to Others: Bring as many people with me to heaven as I can with God's power.

Once we experience peace for the here and now and have the assurance of being heaven-bound, our goal is to grow our relationship with Jesus. 2 Peter 3:18 states, "But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory both now and forever. Amen." The Bible speaks of many spiritual disciplines, areas we all need to grow. The Ladder has identified 12 Biblical disciplines to live a life of worship to our great God. How about together we each pick an area for growth in 2021? For me, sharing truth boldly ties in with my third life focus of bringing as many people with me to heaven as I can with God's help. We need to reach out into our broken world and rescue people, so they too can experience true peace. People are longing for peace, especially in this time of turmoil. Ask the Lord, "Who shall I befriend?" Luke 6:48 says, "He is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock. And when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently against that house, and could not shake it, for it was founded on the rock." The Ladder was founded, built, and continues to exist on Jesus Christ, the rock.

The Ladder was recently blessed with the generous donation of a new air hockey table from Vicki Sparks, in memory of her son JT, who tragically died in 2009 at the age of 18.

JT lived an abundant life, full of laughter and love that he shared with his family and friends. He traveled to many places in his short life, including Alaska, Bahamas, Virgin Islands, Cape Cod, Maine, Maryland and Little Point Sable, MI, where his family vacationed every summer.

JT grew up living the boating life, first in the Bahamas, then in Maine, where he discovered his love for school, sports, art, and spending time with his friends. At the age of 12, his family moved to Maryland. This was not an easy move for JT, being stripped from the friends he grew up with, but he soon joined a soccer team, discovered his love for music by taking up the saxophone, and attended middle school dances.

At 15, JT started working as a summer lifeguard at the local fitness center. While on lifeguard duty, he would see groups of kids with their camp counselors splashing around and having fun. It didn't take long before he became one of those counselors and discovered his passion for working with kids. He led many weekly theme projects with the kids, including art, play acting, swimming, and fitness activities.

In 2009, JT went off to college in North Carolina. He enjoyed the dorm life, taking classes, and spending time with his new friends. His favorite part was living only six miles from the ocean. Sadly, only five weeks into college, shortly after a storm had swept through the area, JT was fatally struck by lightning while he was swimming in the ocean.

Nothing can prepare a parent for the loss of a child. Support from loved ones and guidance from the Lord have been crucial in the healing process. The air hockey table dedicated to the fun-loving, talented, and generous JT is a blessing and a wonderful gift to memorialize his desire to continue working with kids.
