Today, many in our community are depressed and without hope. I believe there is only one true hope. His name is Jesus. That is why I want to make Jesus famous in Shelby. I have been blessed and given the opportunity to bless others in our community. I trust that you feel the same way.

God has called me to three things in Shelby:

- 1. God wants me to love Him with my whole heart, soul, mind, and strength.
- God wants me to love the beautiful people who walk through The Ladder's door (from Shelby and beyond) with an unconditional love—the love of Christ.
- 3. God has placed me at The Ladder to help Him gather a group of authentic, down-to-earth people to PRAY, to LOVE those who walk through The Ladder's doors, and to INVEST in the community and in God's Kingdom. Together, we can bring hope to those without hope. Together, we can make a difference. Consider the impact of Jesus's 12 disciples 12 ordinary men willing to risk and trust God to do hard things.

Many of you are fully engaged in what God has called you to do at The Ladder or in the community. I am so grateful for your investment in God's work and the people of our community. Would you pray about how you can, in faith, become more involved in the work here? If you are not currently involved, would you join us? We need all hands on deck!

An eighth grade young man's family is in a difficult situation. His single mom is expecting another baby soon. He knows the gig. When Mom goes back to work, he will be expected to care for the baby. What would it look like to extend the love of God to his mom and his family? We want this young man to be focused on school, have opportunity to attend The Ladder, and to help his family with age-appropriate chores—not be a parent. We not only pour love and support into our youth, but their families as well. It takes prayer, volunteers, and money to embrace these families. We need your help.

We serve the youth five days a week, 52 weeks a year. We are boots on the ground from 3 to 5 pm, 260 days a year for this young man and other middle and high school youth. This takes volunteers. This takes money to pay our staff, who organize and lead The Huddle during the school year and the Summer Break Out program in the summer. We need your help.

The Ladder needs funding for Kids Hope, a mentoring partnership between The Ladder and Shelby Elementary. The school is crying out for additional mentors to help kindergarten through fifth grade students and their families. We need more adults to mentor one child, one hour a week. We need your help.

The Ladder provides meals for vulnerable adults in our community. We ask for meal participants to pay \$3.50 a meal or what they can, but this year the money taken in from the meal participants only covered about half the cost of the meals. We are short about \$500 a month just for the meals, not to mention the cost of staff to run the program. We need your help.

## PRAY, LOVE, INVEST

People who are willing to risk and trust God to do hard things can change our community and our world. Would you join us? If you know someone who is not currently involved at The Ladder whom the LORD can use to bless our community, would you ask them to join us? Would you or a relative consider designating a gift to The Ladder in your will or trust?

May one more life be changed, just as mine was, because of the loving care and investment of people like you. An investment in The Ladder is an investment that has eternal significance.

## I Want THIS!

\*Julie was a sixth grader last year when she started attending The Huddle. Like all the youth that show up, we have celebrated her, encouraged her, prayed for her and shared God's Word with her.

Occasionally I will do something with the youth called "Community Questions." I give each youth a list of questions and pair them up with another person. They sit across from each other in the cafe and take turns asking questions and listening to each other. First-timers are hesitant for about two questions, but soon they are all locked in and engaged as they get to know the person sitting across from them.

I paired Julie, who was a young, non-Christian Shelby middle-schooler, with an older, homeschooled, Jesus-loving girl named \*Katie. These two couldn't be more different, yet they smiled, laughed and were serious at times during their conversation. After the first 16 questions, there is one last question that gives the students the option of praying for the other person. I watched as Katie prayed for Julie. It was awesome! Over the next couple of months, these two girls developed a friendship and often hugged each other before leaving The Ladder each day.

Fast forward one year to October 27, 2023. To conclude a lesson in which the Gospel was presented, the students were invited to receive Jesus' gift of salvation and make Him King of their life. After we prayed, I said, "If there is anyone who received Jesus for the first time today, then make sure you tell me before you leave." Two young people told me they received Jesus: one sixth grade boy and Julie!

I asked Julie to explain why she made that decision to receive Jesus. She said, "Well, I've been wondering who I am and which way to go. Today I just decided that I want THIS!" (She put her fingers together, then spread her arms apart as she said, "THIS!")

"What do you mean," I asked.

"This place [The Ladder] is amazing, and this is what I want."

The Ladder is a place where community happens. Meaningful peer friendships, caring mentors, your prayers and financial support are changing lives one "Julie" at a time. I look forward to the day when Julie is 15-years-old and sitting across from a sixth grade girl in the café asking her 16 questions and then praying for her. We all want THIS!
